View from THE CHAIR

Higher Education continues to operate in a period of heightened global uncertainty.

South Africa, Namibia, and the international Higher Education community are navigating profound shifts: constrained public funding, escalating student demands and costs, rapid digital acceleration, demographic change, and intense competition for students, staff, and research capacity.

Institutions are expected to do more with less, while maintaining academic excellence and operational resilience.

A useful way to understand this moment is through the metaphor of an international transport network.

Each University or College functions as a key hub with its own unique local mission, but it is the strength of the shared routes - the airports, flight paths, systems and logistics that connect them - that determines how efficiently the entire network reaches its destination.

The global community convened recently in Johannesburg for the 2025 G20 Summit in that same spirit of structured connectivity and coordinated purpose,

As an international partnership of global leaders, the G20's themes of Solidarity, Equality, and Sustainability speak directly to PURCO SA's mandate and mission.

Solidarity recognises that no country should be left behind. In the same way, no institution should face procurement, contract-management, tenders or compliance challenges in isolation.

Equality demands fair access regardless of status or location. At PURCO SA we ensure that all Members, irrespective of resourcing levels or procurement maturity, receive equitable access to technical support, specialist services, and savings opportunities.

Sustainability: The G20 positions sustainability as meeting today's needs without compromising future generations. We apply this through long-term value creation, well-structured contracts, and robust systems that remain dependable as the sector evolves and transforms.



The full value of collective procurement will only be unlocked when Members actively work with the Consortium.

Targeted Segments, Unified Purpose

Just as a transport system relies on specialised infrastructure, PURCO SA's five core business segments - tenders, contract management, consultancy services, professional development, and PURQ - each deliver focused functionality to our Members.

Individually, these services solve specific operational challenges. Together, they form a resilient, high-performing network that supports institutional effectiveness and enables sector-wide progress.

The past year has been exceptional. Eighty two institutions utilised contracts negotiated by PURCO SA, lifting procurement spend by more than 16% to R3.6 billion and bringing cumulative Member spend to over R26 billion since 2010. The scale underscores the depth and breadth of PURCO SA's contribution to our Higher Education community and ecosystem.

Collaboration and Collective Strength

Over the past year, the Consortium returned R99 million to Members in PURCO SA and PURQ rebates. Combined with savings from our national framework agreements and individual contracts, PURCO SA has delivered more than R3.3 billion in cumulative savings and rebates to our Members since 2010.

These figures are not abstract. They represent student services, safeguarded institutional capacity, and improved operational resilience at a time when Higher Education remains under significant pressure.

As demands and complexity increase and resources remain constrained, collective efficiencies are essential to our sector's long-term stability.

Digital Infrastructure for a Changing World

The global shift toward digital technologies has become the baseline for modern Higher Education.

Our eTender System now serves as a critical component of shared digital infrastructure. Originally implemented under pandemic conditions, it has evolved into a high-performance platform capable of supporting both simple and highly complex tender processes securely, efficiently, and at scale for our Members and suppliers.

During the past year suppliers purchased 5894 tender documents and submitted 3581 unique bids through the system. Its streamlined work flows reduced the administrative burden for both Members and suppliers, and ensured fair, secure access to tenders.

Looking Ahead – A Personal Call to Our Members

The road ahead will test all of us. It is clear that uncertainty will continue to challenge Higher Education, and no institution can easily navigate this landscape alone.

By combining each Members' institutional independence with our Consortium's connectivity; by delivering specialised support through our collaborative network; and by maintaining strict professional standards PURCO SA will continue to be there for our Members.

But I need to reiterate that while PURCO SA is equipped and ready, the strength of our Consortium is directly correlated with the commitment and participation of our Members. The full value of collective procurement can only be unlocked when Members actively work with and support their Consortium.

I urge you to take advantage of PURCO SA - draw on the systems and expertise we have built for your benefit, let us manage your tenders, use our contracts and consulting services, engage early, and align your internal processes.

I encourage each institution to deepen your partnership with us - not for PURCO SA's sake, but for your own and for the resilience and sustainability of our entire Higher Education system. Together, we can achieve far more for ourselves, our institutions and our students than any of us can achieve alone.

I extend my warm congratulations to our CEO, Selvan Govender, on receiving the first PURCO SA Lifetime Achievement Award. His vision, integrity and unwavering commitment have shaped the Consortium into the world class body it is today, and it is a privilege to work with him.

For 47 years PURCO SA has facilitated collaboration between Institutions of higher learning and their associated research and standards bodies.

PURCO SA is a non-profit procurement consortium created by and for South African and Namibian higher education institutions.

Our experienced staff leverages the collaborative buying power and expertise of our Members to manage tenders, negotiate national contracts, provide consulting services, and help facilitate better use of our Members' resources.

Our Members include all South African public universities, as well as TVET and CET Colleges, and allied bodies such as the African Health and Research Institute, CAPRISA, the CSIR, SABS and the National Research Foundation.

Our Members include forward thinking private Higher Education Institutions who recognise the value of collaborative engagement.

Our core offering is our ability to manage effective tender processes and negotiate value-adding contracts through the bulk buying power of our Consortium's large membership.

Our contracts and tender management services are bolstered by a range of additional services tailored for Higher Education procurement.

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We have negotiated and managed billions of Rands of tenders and procurement contracts for the sector and for individual Members.

We have managed simple RFQs through to highly complex multi-component, multi-stage tenders with hundreds of bidders.

We actively encourage knowledge sharing, and spend millions helping our Members collaborate, learn and get exposure to the latest learnings and practices.

We deliver significant cash and efficiency savings to the sector, and consequently to its students. Since PURCO SA started recording contractual savings for our Member Institutions in 2010, it has delivered almost R3 Billion Rand of savings and rebates to Higher Education Institutions.

Our additional services include our wholly owned academic information platform, PURQ, which provides a centralised repository of some 75% of South African Higher Education academic information; and the PURCO SA Consultancy Service that delivers strategic and task specific interventions as well as executive and operational staff deployments. ■

ISO 9001:2015 – Strengthening PURCO SA's Reputation, Service Excellence, and Internal Capability

PURCO SA's continued achievement of ISO 9001:2015 certification reaffirms our position as a trusted and professional partner to the Higher Education sector.

The ISO 9001:2015 globally recognised quality standard underscores our commitment to consistent, transparent, and accountable service delivery across all procurement and support functions. It enhances governance practices, bolsters Member confidence, and positions PURCO SA as a benchmark for operational excellence within the sector.

Independent audit

Since first attaining certification in 2012, PURCO SA has been independently audited by the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) and has successfully maintained compliance for over a decade.



In 2025, we achieved yet another successful recertification—further strengthening trust in our systems, demonstrating organisational resilience, and reinforcing the value we deliver to our Member Institutions.

Internal improvement

Importantly, the ISO framework has also driven meaningful internal improvements. Through bi-annual internal audits, our staff continuously refine processes, strengthen controls and enhance service delivery.

These regular audits foster a culture of learning, accountability and continuous improvement—building internal capability and ensuring that our teams remain aligned with best-practice standards.

This long-standing commitment to quality and people development continues to shape a more efficient, reliable and future-ready Higher Education procurement landscape.

QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

PURCO SA conducts two internal audits each year, led by SAQI-certified auditors. These audits provide direct insight into process performance, compliance gaps, and improvement opportunities.

In addition, an annual external audit is undertaken by the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) as part of our three-year ISO certification cycle. In 2025, PURCO SA successfully completed Surveillance Audit 1, reaffirming our adherence to ISO 9001:2015 and the effectiveness of our Quality Management System.

CAPACITY BUILDING

Capacity building and continuous improvement remain central to our approach. Member training takes place twice a year with a focus on quality, compliance, and procurement best practice. Enterprise and Supplier Development (ESD) training is delivered annually to support supplier growth, empowerment, and transformation within the higher education and TVET sectors.

MEMBER SATISFACTION SURVEYS

To ensure that our services remain responsive and Member-centred, PURCO SA conducts Member Satisfaction Surveys twice a year. Feedback from these surveys is actively used to refine processes, enhance systems, and strengthen service delivery.

Through these structured quality initiatives, PURCO SA continues to:

- Maintain full compliance with ISO 9001:2015.
- Strengthen a culture of accountability and continuous improvement.
- Improve Member and supplier satisfaction through efficient, transparent processes.
- Build internal and external capability through ongoing training and development.
- Use Member feedback to drive targeted improvements.
- Deliver ethical, value-driven, and sustainable procurement solutions.


COMMITMENT

Our commitment to quality ensures that the Consortium not only meets, but consistently exceeds the expectations of our Members, supporting excellence across the higher education and TVET procurement landscape.

Working to ensure MEMBER SATISFACTION

The October Member Survey showed stronger performance across every index, with an overall average increase of 4% between April and October 2025. More than 100 representatives from a broad cross-section of Member institutions participated. Notable improvements included a 91% rating confirming that PURCO SA-managed tender

processes are fair, open, objective, and transparent, and a 90% positive assessment that information provided is reliable, accurate, up to date, and delivered on time.

Reviewing THE PAST YEAR

Exceptional spend performance

PURCO SA continues to achieve significant multi-year advances in spend data. Overall member spend via PURCO SA contracts increased by 15.6% YoY, ending the year at R3.57 billion.

Underlying business exceeds expectations

Consolidated Profit Before Tax and Rebates for the Group increased by 18% to R105.1 million, while Rebates due to Members increased by 25% to R98.7 million.

Significant growth in University participation

Spend by Universities via PURCO SA contracts increased by 21.7% in 2024. At R2.2 billion Universities continue to account for the bulk (71%) of total Membership spend.

Universities also significantly increased their participation in PURCO SA managed tenders, increasing 29% year on year.

PURQ consolidates position

PURQ, the wholly owned subsidiary of PURCO SA, consolidated its position in 2025. Whilst Revenue and Profit Before Tax and Rebates contracted slightly, the business increased its contribution, returning R11.6 million in rebates to participating Members.

Negotiations are in progress to renew agreements with Members and Partners, and are expected to be finalised in the new year.

Strong Consultancy

The Consulting Services Division continued to contribute to the Group, with R45.4 million in income for the year from 37 projects with 16 Member Institutions.

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R99 million in Member Rebates

Total rebates attributable to Members totalled R98.7 million in 2025. Since 2010 PURCO SA has paid out more than half a Billion Rand in rebates to Member Institutions.

Private Higher Education Members shine

Forward thinking private Higher Education institutions have embraced PURCO SA membership. Coming off a small base, the segment increased its spend through PURCO SA contracts by 898 percent.

TVET and CET sector achieves gains

TVET and CET Colleges represent a combined 40% of PURCO SA Membership, and are responsible for 51% of tenders managed during the year. After another year of consistent spend growth (17.4%) the sector now accounts for 26% of Member spend.

Member savings reaching R3 Billion

In addition to the efficiency gains, shared knowledge and time savings that come from being part of the Consortium, Member institutions derived savings and rebates of R414 million for the year. This takes cumulative savings since 2010 to R2.89 billion. ■

Chief Executive's REPORT

South Africa's economy remained subdued in 2025, with growth constrained to roughly 1.3%. Although inflation moderated and structural reforms gathered some pace, the higher-education environment remained difficult.

Our Member Institutions work in an environment of limited funds, constrained resources, and high demands. Procurement processes, in particular, are more complex, time-critical and resource-intensive.

It is in precisely this challenging space that the PURCO SA Consortium plays an indispensable role - strengthening institutional capacity, injecting specialist skills, and enabling our Member Institutions to procure efficiently, transparently and at scale through advanced, sector-specific systems.

As a consortium built to drive collaboration, PURCO SA continues to deliver substantial and measurable value across the entire South African higher education sector.

Today we represent the overwhelming majority of institutions, including all South African public universities, 22 TVET Colleges, 4 CET Colleges, private Higher Education institutions, Research and Standards bodies, and the Namibia University of Science and Technology.

In 2025, Members channelled R3.6 billion in spend through PURCO SA contracts.

The 2024–2025 financial year was one of the strongest periods in the organisation's history, with growth across almost every core activity.

Our central mandate remains constant: to deliver financial benefit, operational efficiency and professional support to our Members by leveraging the power of collective procurement.

These advantages are most visible in our tendering and contracting work, but extend equally to our Consultancy division, our PURQ data platform, and our commitment to strengthening the professional expertise of procurement practitioners and their supplier partners across the country.

The achievements documented in this Report are the result of organisational discipline and expertise. The promotion of Ms Meshal Moonsamy to Group Chief Operations Officer in 2024 was pivotal, and her leadership directly shaped the year's outcomes.



Our mandate is clear: to deliver operational efficiency, financial benefit and professional support to our Members by leveraging the power of collective procurement.

Membership

Membership remained stable at 66 institutions, reflecting a clear endorsement of the value, reliability, and integrity of our systems and services. All 26 public universities continue to support the Consortium. In addition, we now represent almost half of all TVET and CET Colleges, alongside private higher-education institutions and national research and standards bodies.

Financial performance and Member value

Group financial performance continued to exceed strategic targets. Revenue reached R161 million, while Profit Before Tax and Rebates rose 18% to R105 million.

Including PURQ, we returned R98.7 million in rebates to Members, a 25% increase year-on-year and part of a sustained compound annual growth rate of 34% since 2010.

The Consultancy Division and the PURQ business remain key contributors, both strengthening our financial position and delivering direct, measurable value to Members and their students.

Tender management services

Tender management remained a central area of focus. Our team oversaw 308 complex tenders during 2024–2025, averaging of 26 per month and with more than half delivered by the TVET Business Unit.

Institutions are increasingly relying on PURCO SA for high-value, multi-dimensional and risk-sensitive procurements, while managing simpler tenders and RFQs internally.

Our deliberate shift away from tenders requiring physical submissions continues to yield significant gains.

With only one carefully justified exception, all 2024–2025 tenders were processed through the e-Tender Online Submission System.

This has sharply reduced administrative burden for both PURCO SA and Member institutions, strengthened data security, improved accuracy, and enabled the up-skilling of our procurement team.

Online submissions increased by 39% to 3 581, with automation driving substantial time and cost efficiencies.

Supplier engagement

Supplier engagement continues to accelerate. Our free Supplier Database expanded to more than 33 000 companies, ranging from multi-nationals to budding entrepreneurs. They purchased 5 894 tender documents, a 39% increase from 4 254 in 2024, and recorded an average of 15 bidders per tender.

Cumulative savings since 2010 have exceeded R3.3 billion.

Contract spending and savings

Member spend through PURCO SA contracts increased by 16% to R3.6 billion in 2025, while Members realised R471 million in procurement savings and rebates.

Growth trends across Member segments were particularly encouraging: Private Higher Education spend increased from R2 million in 2023 to R25 million in 2025, while our Public Universities increased their year on year contract spend by 19% to R2.6 billion.

International quality standards

Our commitment to the international ISO 9001:2015 quality standards have helped the Consortium develop and maintain consistent, world class service levels.

The standards provide a disciplined framework for process control, risk management, documentation, and continuous improvement — all essential in a sector where accuracy, compliance, and auditability are non-negotiable.

During the year we once again successfully completed an ISO 9001:2015 recertification audit.

This outcome reaffirms the robustness of our systems and our commitment to internationally recognised standards of quality, governance, and customer service.

CEO Report continued

Consultancy services and PURQ

Consulting revenue reached R45.4 million in 2025 growing at a 28% compound annual rate since 2020.

PURQ consolidated its market position as the sector's only centralised not for profit academic information platform, contributing R16 million in revenue and returning R11.6 million to our Members in rebates.

PURCON 2025 Annual Conference

The 2025 PURCON Annual Conference, held at the Sandton Convention Centre, was another landmark success. The event once again sold out, attracting 658 delegates from 49 institutions and 87 exhibitors.

Participants rated the conference highly, with 92% indicating they would attend again and an overall rating of 91% for content, organisation and venue quality.

Professional development

Investment in people remains central to our purpose.

Some two hundred emerging suppliers received free Supplier Development training, and 118 procurement professionals from our Member institutions completed advanced courses in Strategic Procurement Cost Saving.

Recognising the value of our Conference, PURCO SA also invested R950 470 (ex VAT) in sponsored attendance by 95 higher education professionals at the event.

Bursaries and Internships

Through student bursaries and PURCO SA internships, we continue to support skills development in supply chain management. Most interns moving into full-time roles within higher education and a number receive permanent roles at PURCO SA.

R1.5 million was invested in professional development

Good causes

Our commitment to social responsibility remains unwavering. PURCO SA continues to support the King's Hope Development Foundation, with staff enthusiastically volunteering their time and effort to support the organisation's community initiatives.

Vote of thanks

I extend sincere appreciation to our Members, Suppliers, staff, Regional Committees and our Board of Directors for their unwavering support during the past year.

Special acknowledgement is due to our Executive Team, under the leadership of Group Chief Operations Officer Meshal Moonsamy, whose steady and insightful guidance successfully steered the organisation through a challenging year.

We look toward 2026 with confidence. The Consortium is well positioned to deepen our value proposition, strengthen the higher-education procurement landscape, and continue delivering meaningful impact for our Member institutions and their students.

Beyond the substantial efficiency gains and cost savings delivered through collaborative contracting, Members also benefit annually from an equitable share of the Consortium's financial surplus.

This distribution is directly proportional to each institution's spend through PURCO SA contracts, giving Members clear and direct influence over the value they receive.


During the 2024-2025 period, Member Institutions procured goods and services worth R3.6 billion through PURCO SA contracts.

This collective activity generated R373 million in savings through negotiated collaborative pricing, supported by a further R87 million in rebates. PURCO SA's wholly owned subsidiary, PURQ, contributed an additional R12 million in rebates for the year.


Taken together, the direct financial return to Members for the year ending July 2025 amounted to R460 million, a figure that excludes the significant efficiencies, administrative streamlining, and collaborative knowledge sharing that accompany participation in the Consortium.

Furthermore, PURCO SA invested R950 460 to sponsor the attendance of 95 Members and key industry stakeholders at PURCON 2025, the Consortium's Annual Conference, reinforcing our commitment to collaboration, sector development, professional growth and shared learning.

Cumulative savings and rebates since 2010




Savings through PURCO SA contracts

DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION

The management of tenders solely via the online tender platform has increased by a compound growth rate of 46.5% since online submissions were implemented.

The online tender system has resulted in enormous cost and efficiency gains for PURCO SA staff and Members, saving significant data capture costs and enabling staff to be up-skilled to more analytical roles.

SUPPLIER ENGAGEMENT

5894 tender documents were purchased and downloaded by suppliers in 2024-25, a 39% increase compared to 2024.

On average 491 tenders are purchased per month, while 24.2 tenders were purchased per published tender..

Since online payments were introduced in 2017, suppliers have purchased 27 985 tender documents through our online payments portal, with all transactions automatically invoiced and recorded against the suppliers' records.

The e-Tender system has recorded 7 974 submitted bids since it was implemented in 2021, with 3 581 in 2024-2025.

The largest tender since inception of the system was recorded in 2025, with 272 prospective bidders and 206 submitted bids.






Online submissions received

CONTRACT SPEND

Spend through PURCO SA contracts is a reliable proxy for the Consortium's value to Members.

The 2024-2025 financial year recorded double digit growth in Member Spend, with contract spend up 16% to R3.6 billion for the year, compared to the prior year's R3.1 billion.

SPEND BY REGION

With the exception of the Western Cape all regions achieved growth for the year, with an overall YoY increase of 16%.

The Central Region increased their procurement spend by 22%, while increasing the average spend per Member from R33m to R42m.

The top 20 contract categories account for 90% of Member spend. Security remains the largest spend category, followed in 2025 by Bus Transport Services, Construction, Catering and Computers in the top 5.

The Top 5 categories account for represent 55% of Member Procurement Spend.

Three of the top 20 categories returned growth in excess of 100%. Spend on Car Rental Services increased by 376%, Travel and Accommodation by 141% and Computers by 101%

CONTRACTED SUPPLIERS

PURCO SA managed 674 contracts and collected rebates from 687 suppliers during the year. The top twenty contracted suppliers for 2024-2025 account for 35% of procurement spend, compared to 32% in 2023.

The top supplier for the year was the University of KwaZulu-Natal for the Provision of Student Accommodation, a contract valued at R170.3 million. The next highest suppliers were HG Travelling Services (R92 million), Mi 7 National Security Group (R82 million) and Bidfood (R79 million).






CONTRACTED SUPPLIERS: B-BBEE TRANSFORMATION


Black Ownership




B-BBEE scorecard




5-year spend trends - top 5 categories




2025 spend by sector




2025 Top 20 spend

Student impact BAROMETER

All work done by PURCO SA is ultimately designed to help educate more students.

Our Student Impact Barometer is an indicative measure of how well we are doing.

Methodology

The Student Impact Barometer provides a simple, straightforward illustration of the potential impact of PURCO SA's work.

It serves as a reminder of why collaborative procurement matters and how it can translate into meaningful value for our Member Institutions and their students.

The methodology is deliberately simple and is not presented as a definitive analysis.

Each year, we calculate the average first-year tuition cost for BA and B.Com degrees across a representative sample of institutions. For 2025, this average was R36 665.

We then determine how many students could theoretically have been funded if the year's savings and rebates were redirected to cover their tuition.

In 2024–25, Members realised R460 million in savings and rebates through their spend on PURCO SA contracts, bringing the cumulative total since 2010 to R3.3 billion.

On this basis, the savings and rebates from the 2024–2025 financial year could have funded 12 540 first-year students, while the cumulative total since 2010 would have paid for 89 917 students.


STRONG PERFORMANCE

The Consultancy Division once again contributed positively to overall PURCO SA revenue for the year.

The Division earned R45.4 million in revenue for 2024 - 2025, bringing the total to R175 million earned since the unit was created. This represents a 28% annualised compound growth rate from 2020 to date.

BROAD SCOPE OF PROJECTS

The Consultancy Division was tasked with 37 projects for 16 institutions during the 2024-25 financial period. Projects and engagements included once off interventions as well as multi-year contracts for TVET Colleges and Universities.



PURQ academic INFORMATION PLATFORM

The Business

PURQ is a state-of-the-art academic information platform that provides a unique online service for students and graduates.

Its purpose is to make verified academic information accessible and to help students realise direct, tangible benefits from their qualifications.

The platform is wholly owned by PURCO SA on behalf of its Higher Education Members, with an explicit mandate to deliver measurable value to students and graduates.

While advancing the interests of users, PURQ also generates revenue and savings for the institutions that contribute their academic records to the platform. Participating contributors receive ongoing annuity income, cost reductions, and material benefits in risk management and resource optimisation.

They also share in the annual surplus: in 2025, R12 million was rebated to participating Members. These benefits require no capital outlay, no licensing fees, no system development, and no ongoing operational cost..

Contributors and partners

Approximately 80% of South Africa's academic information footprint is represented on the platform. This includes the Namibia University of Science and Technology and private colleges within the IIE Group.

Engagements with the remaining non-participating institutions continue to progress, and further data contributions are expected in 2025.

Value proposition

PURQ offers four core services to students and Higher Education institutions:

- A collaborative, online source of verified academic information
- Enrolment verification services
- Secure electronic exchange of academic transcripts
- Financial and retail benefits for students, including risk profiling and credit scorecard applications.

Before PURQ's intervention, graduates with limited credit histories were conservatively assessed using models that ignored academic qualifications, often resulting in higher interest rates.

PURQ has built relationships with banks, credit bureaux, and background-screening companies to deliver student-specific financial advantages.

Working with credit bureaux, PURQ has helped develop alternative data scorecards that incorporate academic performance, enabling graduates to qualify for improved and more competitive interest rates.

Data privacy and security


All data on the PURQ platform is held in custodial trust for the originating institutions.

Access is governed by stringent security and privacy controls. PURQ is fully POPIA-compliant, uses local data centres, and aligns with international financial-industry security standards.

Financial performance

Since PURCO SA completed the acquisition of PURQ the business has delivered positive results

- 36.6% compound annual revenue growth
- R106 million in revenue
- R61 million surplus rebated to participating Member Institutions. ■



THE LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Selvan Govender LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT

In 2025 PURCO SA conferred its first-ever Lifetime Achievement Award on its Chief Executive Officer, Selvan Govender, in recognition of an exceptional record of transformation, institutional impact and sustained results over 17 years of leadership.

Selvan was appointed CEO in 2008. At the time, the value of PURCO SA's collaboration, measured by Member Spend through PURCO SA contracts, was R300 million.

Under Selvan's leadership, spend rose more than 10-fold to R3.6 billion in 2025, while annual Member savings and income rose from R63 million to R472 million over the same period. Since he implemented formal impact tracking in 2010, Members have recorded more than R3.3 billion in cumulative savings and rebates as a direct consequence of being part of the Consortium.

Membership has expanded from a predominantly university-based collaboration to a national higher-education consortium representing all public universities and almost half of TVETs and CET Colleges - expanding to 66 Member Institutions by 2025.

Selvan's tenure has been defined by structural reform and long-term institutional strengthening. He recognised the necessity of rigorous standards, securing ISO 9001:2015 certification and establishing PURCO SA as a quality-assured, internationally benchmarked organisation.

He led the acquisition and scaling of PURQ, a national academic-information platform enabling students to access academic records and beneficial lending terms while creating a no-cost, no-risk revenue stream for contributing institutions. PURQ delivers tangible student benefits, sector-wide efficiencies and a self-sustaining collaborative asset for Members.

Selvan also established the PURCO SA Management Consultancy. This deliberately broadened the Consortium beyond its procurement origins, giving Members access to deep functional expertise through a cost-effective, higher-education-centred consulting capability.



A profound technology modernisation has taken place under his leadership. PURCO SA moved from manual, paper-and-Excel based processes to a fully integrated online digital ecosystem that supports the entire procurement life cycle from supplier registration through tender submissions to contract management.

Infrastructure has also been transformed: the organisation now operates from its own solar-powered state-of-the-art premises in Midrand.

Selvan has reshaped the Consortium's governance and national presence. Once centred mainly on procurement managers, PURCO SA now engages CFOs, CTOs, Heads of Facility Services, Registrars, Vice-Chancellors and senior government leadership.

This reflects a deliberate strategic shift to position the Consortium as a system-level partner to Higher Education..

The Annual Conference, once a small gathering, is now a world-class, sold-out four-day event combining high-level content, executive attendance and an exhibition of nearly 100 suppliers.

Selvan's leadership style has been consistently forward-thinking, solutions-driven and anchored in integrity. He is approachable, encourages open dialogue and welcomes diverse perspectives. He leads from the front, engages directly with operational detail, and is unwavering in choosing the right course of action over expediency.

Selvan's has established a legacy that will shape the collaboration for many years to come, and no individual is more deserving of this recognition..

On behalf of the entire Consortium and its Members, PURCO SA extends our congratulations to Selvan on receiving the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Investing in PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Annual PURCON Conference

The 2025 PURCON Annual Conference and Expo again reached capacity early, with 658 attendees from 49 Member Institutions, and 87 exhibiting companies participating in the event.

PURCO SA sponsored attendance for staff from every Member Institution. Ninety-five Members utilised this benefit in 2025, representing an investment of R950 470 in strengthening sector capability.

Bursaries and internships

PURCO SA funds bursaries for SCM undergraduates, with recipients eligible to enter our Procurement Internship Programme. The six-month internship at the National Office has launched the careers of several talented individuals, with selected interns offered permanent positions on completion. Three interns accepted permanent roles at PURCO SA in the past year.

Staff development

PURCO SA provides financial and other support for staff members engaged in self improvement and study. The investment provides staff with growth opportunities within the Consortium, and helps professionalise the service offered to Members.

Congratulations go to our most recent graduate Pulane Motsepe, our Group Operations Administrator, who completed her Bachelor of Commerce degree.

Member and Supplier training

More than 200 Members and emerging suppliers received free training through our Member and Supplier and Enterprise Development programmes.

Small business owners face rising competition, shifting consumer trends, and limited access to funding. The Business Fundamentals Programme focusses on practical financial, planning, and sales skills to build more resilient enterprises.

The Strategic Procurement Cost Savings Programme, attended by 118 Members, provided essential concepts and practical tools to implement effective, organisation-aligned cost-saving strategies.

Ponder virtual events

We continue to offer free Ponder webinars for Members and Suppliers. Ponder provides ideas, insights, and practical guidance through a virtual platform where colleagues and partners can share knowledge and derive tangible value for their institutions and companies.

2025 PURCO SA CONFERENCE



PURCON 2025 ANNUAL CONFERENCE

PURCON is PURCO SA's Annual Conference and Exhibition and serves as the Consortium's flagship learning, engagement and sector-building forum.

The event has achieved sustained growth and full capacity for the past three consecutive events. PURCON 2025 was hosted at the Sandton Convention Centre and was preceded, as customary, by the National Meeting for senior procurement executives from Member Institutions.

Widely respected for the quality of its programme, speakers, and structured engagement opportunities, PURCON addresses key themes across Procurement, Finance, ICT, and Facilities Management.

It brings together decision-makers from universities, TVET and CET colleges, and research and standards bodies across southern Africa, enabling wide-ranging collaboration with peers and supplier partners.

Minister of Higher Education

Minister of Higher Education, Mr Buti Manamela was a keynote speaker in 2025. In his remarks the Minister emphasised PURCO SA's importance as an effective collaborative resource and community for Universities, Colleges and their associated institutions.

The Minister was accompanied by a large delegation from the Department of Higher Education and Training, underscoring the value of the Conference as a platform for higher education procurement, governance, and sector alignment.

Engagement and Supplier Development


